Strong topline growth, positive operating leverage and forex gain drove profit

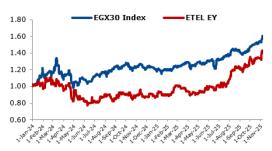
- Expects to exceed its 2025 guidance provided earlier for topline growth and EBITDA margin, while maintaining guidance for capex.
- Customer base rose steadily across fixed line, fixed broadband and mobile segments by 6.8%, 8.3% and 8.8% YOY, respectively, in 3Q25. Fixed line ARPU rose 35.1% YOY to EGP 314.4, and fixed data ARPU rose 27.2% YOY to EGP 49.0 in 3Q25 due to a price adjustment that happened across the Retail segment in late 2024.
- Cash Capex excluding mobile license reached EGP 20.7 Bn in 9M25, with In-Service Capex of EGP 12.2 Bn in 9M25.
- Telecom Egypt's Express Subsea Cable "Coral Bridge" completed, connecting Egypt and Jordan.

3Q25 Net Profit higher than our estimate

Telecom Egypt's (the Company) net profit more than tripled from EGP 2,126 Mn in 3Q24 to EGP 6,461 Mn in 3Q25, exceeding our estimate of EGP 4,620 Mn. This robust growth is supported by strong revenue growth across both the Wholesale and Retail segments, complemented by positive operating leverage, higher income from associates, and a decline in net finance cost driven by foreign exchange gain compared to a loss in 3Q24, partially offset by an increase in tax expenses.

P&L Highlights

Telecom Egypt's revenue grew 35.4% YOY to EGP 27,634 Mn in 3Q25, mainly driven by strong growth in the Retail and Wholesale segments. The retail segment was the primary growth driver with revenue rising 38.3% YOY to EGP 15,822 Mn in 3Q25, with data revenue growing 45% YOY supported by price adjustments implemented across the retail portfolio in late 2024. Revenue from Home Services grew 44.1% YOY to EGP 13,265 Mn in 3Q25, supported by a surge in Data and Voice revenue, coupled with higher ARPU and an increasing customer base. On the other hand, Enterprise Solution revenue grew 14.6% YOY to EGP 2,557 Mn in 3Q25, mainly driven by in-voice, data and other services. The Wholesale segment revenues grew 31.7% YOY to EGP 11,812 Mn in 3Q25, driven by a 32% YOY increase in International incoming call revenue and FX appreciation, coupled with a 45% increase in Domestic Infrastructure services revenue. Domestic Wholesale revenue increased significantly 44.3% YOY to EGP 2,838 Mn in 3Q25 supported by an increase in infrastructure revenue. Similarly, revenue from International Carriers surged 35.9% YOY to EGP 5,038 Mn in 3Q25 owing to an increase in international calls traffic and foreign currency appreciation, while IC&N revenue increased 19.5% YOY to EGP 3,936 Mn due to healthy contribution from capacity

increase and international customer support. Furthermore, operating costs rose 21.9% YOY to EGP 15,691 Mn in 3025 due to an increase in call cost driven by currency devaluation, higher staff cost, D&A and other operating costs, partially offset by a marginal decline in maintenance cost and cost of merchandise available for sale. Thus, gross profit grew significantly from EGP 7,533 Mn in 3Q24 to EGP 11,944 Mn in 3Q25, with a gross margin of 43.2% compared to 36.9% in 3024. Selling and overhead expenses increased 11.2% YOY to EGP 3,664 Mn in 3Q25 due to higher expenditure on salaries & wages, commissions of agents and collection organizations, organizations services costs & consultants and other selling & distribution expenses, partially offset by a decline in advertising and marketing costs. Telecom Egypt recorded other operating expenses of EGP 1,306 Mn in 3Q25 compared to an income of EGP 120 Mn in 3Q24 due to higher capital losses owing to fire accident at Ramses Central Building. However, operating profit rose from EGP 4,358 Mn in 3024 to EGP 6,974 Mn in 3025 driven by strong operational performance and ongoing cost optimization initiatives, offsetting the increase in D&A expenses. Similarly, the Company's EBITDA increased from EGP 7,967 Mn in 3Q24 to EGP 12,499 Mn in 3Q25, whereas EBITDA margin surged from 39.0% in 3Q24 to 45.2% in 3Q25, demonstrating strong top line growth coupled with operational efficiency. Income from associates rose significantly from EGP 2,354 Mn in 3Q24 to EGP 4,157 Mn in 3025, owing to the strong contribution from Vodafone Egypt caused by organic growth, coupled with a price hike of telecom services. Net finance costs fell 41.4% YOY to EGP 2,431 Mn in 3Q25, mainly due to forex gains compared to a loss in 3Q24. In addition, income tax expense rose from EGP 476 Mn in 3Q24 to EGP 2,303 Mn in 3Q25.

Balance Sheet Highlights

Telecom Egypt's cash and cash equivalents declined from EGP 9.3 Bn in 2Q25 to EGP 7.4 Bn in 3Q25. The Company's total debt stood at EGP 76.4 Bn in 3Q25, down from EGP 81.0 Bn in 2Q25. The annualized net debt to EBITDA ratio stood at 1.5x in 9M25 compared to 1.6x in 1H25. The Company's in-service capex stood at EGP 12.2 Bn in 9M25, while the cash capex (excluding mobile licenses) was EGP 20.7 Bn in 9M25. Telecom Egypt's net cash from operating activities decreased from EGP 9.1 Bn in 2Q25 to EGP 5.9 Bn in 3Q25.

Target Price and Rating

We maintain our BUY rating on Telecom Egypt with a revised target price of EGP 75.25. Telecom Egypt reported strong financial results in the 3Q25, driven by increased ARPU, a growing subscriber base, rising call traffic, and enhanced pricing across all segments. In 3Q25, the company's customer base expanded, with mobile customers increasing by 8.8% YOY to 14.8 Mn. Fixed broadband subscribers rose by 8.3% YOY to 10.9 Mn, while fixed line users grew by 6.8% YOY to 13.8 Mn. Notably, the ARPU for fixed line and fixed data services increased by 27.2% and 35.1% YOY, respectively, primarily due to a price hike implemented in late 2024. Telecom's net cash from operating activities rose 50.9% YOY to EGP 22.7 Bn in 9M25, along with FCFF of EGP 12.1 Bn in 9M25. It expects to recognize additional revenue from Indefeasible Right of Use in the upcoming quarters. In addition, Telecom Egypt expects to recognize additional revenue from the ICN segment in 4Q25, driven by a strong pipeline. The company also experienced significant growth in income from associates, driven by strong performance from Vodafone, which benefited from improved operational performance, organic growth, and price increases. Additionally, Telecom Egypt continues to benefit from the agreement to receive 60% of VFE's free cash flow as annual dividends, thereby benefiting from higher cash flows. It also managed to control its expense on salary & wages on a QOQ basis by implementing merit increases. Telecom Egypt is also expected to benefit from the declining interest rate environment, as the Egyptian Central Bank cut rates four times in 2025 amid easing inflation. These rate reductions help lower the Company's financing costs and support profitability. Furthermore, Telecom Egypt's board has given preliminary approval for Helios Investments to acquire a 75% to 80% stake in a new subsidiary that will own the Regional Data Hub (RDH), with the business valued between USD 230 Mn and USD 260 Mn, contingent on performance indicators. Telecom Egypt will retain a 20% to 25% stake, pending final agreements, restructuring, regulatory approvals, and an independent fair value assessment. It plans to use the majority of the proceeds for debt repayment from the stake sale. The Company plans to deleverage all debt within four years and aims for a net cash position. Telecom Egypt expects to exceed its topline and EBITDA guidance for FY2025, provided at the beginning of the year, with YOY Revenue growth of low 20s, and EBITDA margin of high 30s. Thus, based on our analysis, we assign a BUY rating on the stock.

Valuation:

We use Discounted Free Cash Flow (DCF) and the Relative Valuation (RV) method to value Telecom Egypt. We have assigned 80% weight to DCF and 20% to the RV method.

1) DCF Method:

Telecom Egypt is valued using free cash flow to the firm. We have discounted the cash flow using the weighted average cost of capital of 14.1%. It is arrived at after using the cost of equity of 15.2% and an after-tax cost of debt of 12.6%. Cost of equity is calculated by using a 10-year government bond yield of 9.8%, beta of 0.70 and an equity risk premium of 7.8%. Government bond yield is calculated after adding Egypt's 10-year spread over the 10-year US risk-free rate. Cost of debt is calculated using a cost of 16.8% after adjusting for a tax rate of 25.4%. Also, assumed a terminal growth rate of 2.5%. We also added the book value of Vodafone Egypt to arrive at the valuation of Telecom Egypt.

2) Relative Valuation:

We have used local as well as international peers to value Telecom Egypt, and it is valued using the EV/EBITDA multiple. We applied a discount to peer valuation since it operates in a region which faced considerable currency risk and expect this discount to be maintained as the risk will not fade out any time soon. It is valued at 2026 EV/EBITDA of multiple of 4.3x compared to a peer multiple of 5.7x.
